Highlights of the experience:

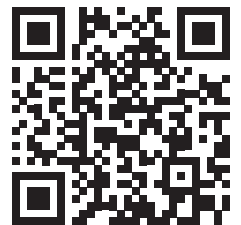
- Q&A between 4th and 5th grade students and America's leading experts on space; these adults are taking on the toughest questions kids have about space!
